Celebrating International Translation Day 2023

What is International Translation Day?

In 2017, the UN General Assembly adopted resolution 71/288 declaring September 30 as International Translation Day to recognize how "professional translation, as a trade and an art, plays an important role in upholding the purposes and principles of the Charter of the United Nations, bringing nations together, facilitating dialogue, understanding and cooperation, contributing to development and strengthening world peace and security." September 30 has historically been the Feast of Saint Jerome, who is known as the patron saint of translators.

How can I celebrate?

Connect with other professionals in the T & I industry! You can do this at in-person events such as the N<u>OTA Picnic and Annual Meeting</u> on September 24, or <u>ATA's 64th Annual Conference</u> this October 25-28. You can also connect to other translators, agencies, and organizations (including <u>NOTA</u>!) on platforms like <u>LinkedIn</u>.
