Hi Ruth,

This may be related to a new phenomenon I recently pointed out on the ATA Business Practices List. The scam is old, ancient even (fake check or identity theft), but the scammers are now apparently bored to the point that they are manually (!!!) scraping data off association websites that the robots cannot get to.

Last weekend, a human with an Indian IP address spent hours on the NCTA website, manually entering captchas and evading other robot-deterrents (because they were obviously human) to get at the profile data. I'm the NCTA Webmaster (NorCal ATA Chapter). So the scammers are now finding new targets that were previously safe, because previously they went after listings that could be scraped easily by robots. Thanks to shelter-in-place orders, the scammers are apparently bored to the point that they're manually scraping data. Since we generally want to be found by humans, there's no way to prevent that. I've since blocked that IP address from access to the NCTA website, but there's no way to prevent them from using a VPN to try again. Perhaps these same outfits or others are doing the same with the ATA profiles.

In general, I expect scams to go up during this global pandemic, because a) the scammers are bored and/or desperate, and b) a lot of T&I professionals are experiencing a drop in work, so they're getting anxious, too, and are thus easier targets for scammers.

Robocalls (automatically blocked) to my business phone have also increased exponentially.
